► **Youth Protection Guidelines: Training For Volunteer Leaders and Parents** ...child abuse prevention education for leaders and parents of Cub Scout and Boy Scout age youth. An excellent orientation to child abuse issues.

It Happened to Me and A Time to Tell ...age specific child abuse prevention programs for Cub Scout and Boy Scout age youth.

► **Youth Protection Guidelines: Training for Adult Venture Leaders**...child abuse prevention education for leaders in Venturing and Exploring. Includes three videos for youth members on Internet Safety and Stalking, Sexual Harassment and Acquaintance Rape.

Scouting Safety...Begins With Leadership...planning model for safe programs using the *Guide to Safe Scouting* and the BSA "Sweet 16 of Safety."

The Risk Zone...highlights safe travel and avoiding "the risk zone"—when drivers can no longer function safely.

► **Safety Afloat**...for requirements when participating in activities on the water. **See the Guide to Safe Scouting for other requirements that apply to activities on the water.*

► **Safe Swim Defense**...for requirements when participating in swimming activities. **See the Guide to Safe Scouting for other requirements that apply for swimming activities.*

Aquatics Supervision: Swimming and Water Rescue...provides information and in-the-water skills to prevent, recognize and respond to swimming emergencies during unit swimming activities.

Aquatics Supervision: Paddle Craft Safety...expands on Safety Afloat to include basic skills and knowledge for unit leaders to supervise most float trips using canoes.

Climb on Safely...for requirements when participating in climbing and rappelling. **See the Guide to Safe Scouting for other requirements that apply for climbing and rappelling activities.*

► **Planning and Preparing for Hazardous Weather**...covers 10 weather related situations to help units be safe during unexpected changes in the weather or in making planning decisions when hazardous weather is expected.

► **The courses with the arrow are offered online. Go to www.Scouting.org. You will need your BSA member number to register for courses. On completion, you will be able to print off a certificate for the courses you take.**

Class size is limited, so register early to assure a place in the course.

Many Scouting programs and activities require that leaders and sometimes youth participants hold certifications in courses such as CPR, First Aid, Youth Protection and others mentioned in this brochure.

Leaders and youth needing certifications for program activities should register early to ensure a place in the course. Those needing any of these courses for summer activities the following year should register and attend the required course as soon as possible.

Leaders involved in Old North State Council sponsored National High Adventure activities are required to have certifications in Adult CPR, First Aid and Wilderness First Aid, Safety and Risk Management. To take advantage of these courses through the Council, you should make plans **NOW** and register for the courses you will need for your activity.

****A Challenge Exam involves testing only.** Participants in a Challenge Exam must pass the written test for the course with a grade of 80% or higher and satisfactorily perform the skills specific to the course being challenged.

There is **NO TRAINING** associated with a **Challenge Exam**. Those not proficient in the knowledge and skills required for the course are encouraged to take a full course.

Standard First Aid with CPR/AED-Adult and CPR Child

Includes Adult CPR, Child CPR, First Aid, and AED. Open to leaders, Boy Scouts and Venturers. Boy Scouts and Venturers **must** attend with a buddy or appropriate adult partner to meet BSA Youth Protection guidelines.

Youth participants must be at least 14 years of age.

Pre-class study is not required, but knowledge of first aid skills in the First Aid Merit Badge Book or Boy Scout Handbook may be helpful.

Wilderness First Aid, Safety and Risk Management

Scouting provides opportunities for enjoying the great outdoors in a wide variety of out-of-the-way, backcountry, wilderness and high adventure areas.

WFASRM was developed through the Old North State Council and includes risk management, pre-trip planning, and provides practical application of knowledge and skills through group activities and scenarios.

This course is especially recommended to those planning and participating in activities where it may take an extended time to reach advanced medical care. WFASRM is required for leaders involved in council sponsored National High Adventure activities.

WFASRM is open to leaders and youth members age 14 or older. Youth members may register only on the recommendation of their Scoutmaster or Crew Leader.

Registration is limited, so early registration is strongly recommended.

Pre-requisites: Current certification in Adult CPR and First Aid are **required**.

To register for this course, obtain a brochure from the Council Service Center or online through the Council website. Online registration is not available for this course.

CPR for the Professional Rescuer

Required to complete and maintain your BSA Lifeguard certification. CPro includes: adult and child CPR/AED, infant CPR, responsibilities of a professional rescuer, working with EMS and legal considerations for the professional rescuer.

All courses are held at the Old North State Council Service Center unless specified otherwise.
