## Approved Camping Sites for Cub Scout Packs

The Old North State Council is currently rebuilding the list of camping sites that are approved for overnight Cub Scout pack use. According to the *Guide to Safe Scouting*:

*“Pack overnights are pack-organized events involving more than one family from a single pack, focused on age-appropriate Cub Scout activities and conducted at council-approved locations.”*

This means that if a Cub Scout pack wants to conduct an overnight activity at a location other than property owned by a Boy Scout council, it must use a site that has been approved by the local Boy Scout council to ensure that the site is safe and appropriate for Cub Scouts. If a pack uses a site that has not been approved by a local Boy Scout council, those adult leaders will risk personal liability should an incident occur during the activity.

If your pack knows of a camping site they would like to use for an overnight activity in the near future, please send the name, address, and contact information of that site to [Old North State Council](#) for approval. This process is only for those camping sites that are located within the borders of the Old North State Council. Sites in other areas must be approved by the appropriate local Boy Scout council.

Please make sure you submit the request at least two months before the date of your planned overnight activity. This will ensure that there is plenty of time for the council to conduct the site inspection and approve the site. Once a site is approved, it will be added to the master list of approved sites for two years at which time it will need to be reinspected.
